Web technology is growing rapidly, with newer and better capabilities available each year. To take advantage of everything the web has to offer is becoming an increasing challenge. Creating modern web sites with a text editor is difficult at best and not practical if you want a site that will offer interactive tools or shared authoring. A simple web site can be developed with desktop applications and uploaded to a publicly accessible site using file transfer software. This method has the disadvantages of limiting updates to a single desktop and separating editing from the live web site.

A better approach to web site management is the Content Management System (CMS), where the site is built and managed entirely by a web browser connected to the site. A CMS makes it easy to create and modify a site, add sophisticated program functions, and share editing between multiple people. The use of style sheets helps a CMS managed site to have a consistent look and feel, and will adapt your site to desktops or mobile devices such as smart phones.

For many years WVNET has offered web space for customers to upload web pages, style sheets and components to a publicly accessible server. During the past decade we have made extensive use of Content Management Systems for numerous web-based projects, and we are offering these systems to customers. We have newer technology Content Management Systems such as Joomla and Word Press that make it easy to create and manage web sites entirely from your web browser. Content Management Systems have the ability to build complex web sites based on templates that you can obtain at no cost. Choose from thousands of free templates, select the one you like, and create a site based on it. You can change the look and feel of the site at any time by choosing a different template. Add content with a GUI editor, share editing with other people, add programs like calendars, photo galleries and surveys, all with a few clicks on the site.. Many templates will automatically create a mobile version of your site if accessed from a smart phone.

WVNET will provide you with web space to build your site, a pre-installed Content Management System ready for your customization, and a high speed connection to the internet so that your site responds quickly to visitors. 



Update

DegreeWorks Progress: Implementation for the first wave of campuses is progressing. Planning for the software installation is underway. There will be 2 DegreeWorks Overview/Demos (WebEx sessions) scheduled, one for 1/5/12 at 11:00 a.m. Eastern and another 1/12/12 at 11:00 a.m. Eastern. Any participants can attend either session. Dates for scribing and training sessions will start in February and March.

Argos Demo: Several campuses and some folks from WVNET have been testing Evisions Argos reporting tool. We have several campuses anxious to participate in purchasing Argos at a steeply discounted price — if we can get a commitment from at least 14 campuses. Argos is a reporting tool that can access any data source and provides web-based or emailed reports and dashboard capabilities. WVNET's very own Ron Hamilton has developed a sample dashboard.
