Since 2013, the WVU TLC has increased its spectrum of services to include consultations, workshops, on-demand resources, and annual events on a variety of topics aimed at empowering instructors. Specifically, the WVU TLC offers course design/delivery services, classroom technology support, video/infographic assistance, and teaching practices peer support and learning communities. The [TLC Sandbox](#) is a research and development initiative for faculty, GTAs, and staff to evaluate emerging technologies.
