The Monday Opening Keynote Speaker (October 28 at 11:45) is Mr. Earving Blythe, Vice President Emeritus for IT, Virginia Tech, who will be speaking about Community Engagement for Security and Safety. Erv Blythe retired as Vice President for Information Technology, CIO from Virginia Tech in August of 2012. He has a B.A. degree in English (1968). His Masters degree (1983) and doctoral studies are in the Environmental Design and Planning Program of Virginia Tech's College of Architecture. He began employment at Virginia Tech in 1977 after working for 9 years at the U.S. Department of Defense/Department of the Navy. Prior to becoming Vice President in 1991, Mr. Blythe served in a number of roles, including Associate Director of Computing, Director of Communications Resources, and Principal Investigator for several sponsored projects including the development of the Virginia Education and Research Network and of the Network Virginia project. He was also the primary architect of the

University's uniquely successful migration of its administrative systems to an enterprise-wide, client-server based resource that fully leverages the Internet and open systems standards. He provided executive leadership and was the primary advocate for the University's nationally recognized: Electronic Villages program, eCorridor's program, Scholarly Communications/Network-based Publishing project, entry into high performance computing, and cyber security center. The focus of his research for many years was on the technological and market structure obstacles to the emergence of advanced communications network infrastructure and he taught a graduate seminar related to that topic. Blythe has served on nationally recognized committees, task forces and boards of directors - including the Blacksburg Electronic Village, Inc., Virginia Tech's Corporate Research Center, Inc., and the National LambdaRail, Inc. boards. He consults nationally on technology, applications and issues related to public safety and security. **Continued Below...**

The Tuesday Keynote Speaker (October 29 at 11:45) is Dr. Edwin Welch, President, University of Charleston, Charleston, West Virginia, and the title to his keynote is "It Ain't Necessarily So." Dr. Edwin H. Welch is a native of Maryland and earned degrees from Western Maryland College, Boston University School of Theology, and Boston University Graduate School. He studied International Relations at the London School of Economics and Political Science and Higher Education Administration at the Harvard Institute for Educational Management. His Ph.D. is in Social Ethics and he is an ordained minister in the United Methodist Church. Dr. Welch served in the Executive Office of the President at The White House from 1961 until 1971 in the administrations of Presidents Kennedy, Johnson, and Nixon. Dr. Welch began his teaching career at West Virginia Wesleyan College where he

chaired the Sociology and Anthropology Departments. He was a department chair and Assistant Dean at Lebanon Valley College in Pennsylvania, the Academic Vice President at Lakeland College in Sheboygan, Wisconsin, and for eight years Dr. Welch served as the Provost at Wartburg College in Iowa. Dr. Welch has been President of the University of Charleston since 1989. He has led the institution through a period of unprecedented fundraising, doubling of full-time student enrollment, redefining the institution's mission, adding a graduate school of pharmacy and a graduate school of business, constructing 8 of the 12 buildings on campus, acquiring national recognition for UC's leadership in outcomes-based learning and student assessment; and adding new locations in Beckley and Martinsburg, West Virginia as well as in online learning. He created a central administrative computing corporation (Independent College Enterprise, Inc.) which serves eight colleges and universities in four states. Continued on Page Two...

Dr. Welch serves on many boards: BB&T corporate board; BB&T-West Virginia advisory board; Charleston Area Medical Center Health Systems; Chairman of the Quality Committee for the Charleston Area Medical Center; CAMC Health, Education, and Research Institute; President's Advisory Committee for the Association of Governing Boards; West Virginia Independent Colleges and Universities; and the Mountain East Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. He has spoken at national and international meetings and has regularly contributed articles to Trusteeship, the Association of Governing Board's magazine. In May 2006, Dr. Welch was given the first-ever Charles L. Foreman Award for Innovation in Private Higher Education by the Foundation for Independent Higher Education. In August, 2007, Dr. Welch was the proud recipient of the 2007 YMCA Spirit of the Valley Award in recognition of his exemplary community service, and his selfless concern and care for his community. He also has the unique distinction of having a tug boat named for him by the Madison Coal & Supply Company. President Welch is married to a West Virginia native, Dr. Janet Welch.


