REMOTE DISASTER RECOVERY SITE SERVICES NOW AVAILABLE AT WVNET



WVNET is pleased this month to present a feature article by Dave Tamm, CIO and Vice President of Fairmont State University and Pierpont Community and Technical College in Fairmont, West Virginia, dtamm@fairmontstate.edu

"As Fairmont State University and Pierpont Community and Technical College grow and expand, we have seen disk space requirements more than double, and this has caused heavy strain on our current three-head LTO4 tape library. As our space requirements increased, and as the 24/7 requirement for access to this data from anywhere increased, we realized that any storage solution we chose would not only have to meet current and near-term requirements, but to also "do more

with less," as all organizations these days are being asked to do. We chose to partner with WVNET, so more state institutions can benefit from resources that we both share.

Approximately 15 months ago, Fairmont State University and Pierpont Community and Technical College replaced its SAN (storage area network) with a new IBM XIV SAN. There were many reasons for replacement, not the least of which was the fact that our existing SAN, an IBM DS4800, was five years old. Replacement, however, also allowed us to reclaim a full rack in our data center, as well as allow, under our two-year plan, for expansion into SAN replication for disaster recovery at a remote location upon purchase of a second XIV. We chose the XIV over other SAN models due to the built-in advanced features, ease of configuration and management and its complete support model from IBM. This allows a small IT group to provide enterprise class services without the need for specialized SAN skillsets.

As we began planning the purchase of the second XIV in year two, analysis of our remote sites revealed that the infrastructure at all of our remote sites would not meet the needs for a second SAN. Furthermore, with budgets becoming tighter every year, it quickly became clear that sufficient funding would not be available to completely build out those requirements and purchase a second XIV. Upon that realization, we cast about for opportunities that would allow us to gain the same functionality within our existing budget. To that end, we and WVNET have partnered to help accomplish mutual goals with fewer resources: expansion and growth of services. Discussions with WVNET on their needs highlighted some in common with us, including: (continued on Page Two)

- Remote replication to a quality data center
- Increased operational utility efficiencies
- Simple, seamless configuration and replication options

Because Fairmont and Pierpont cannot field a 24/7/365 technical staff, the availability of WVNET staff to act in this role for our data replication, coupled with IBM's real-time remote monitoring and support, is very attractive to us.

As a result of these initial discussions, as well as further discussion of the efficiencies that could be gained for the state as a whole by letting WVNET assume Fairmont State's Blackboard license and hosting, Fairmont State and Pierpont have partnered together with WVNET to accomplish both. WVNET has secured its own XIV SAN, and Fairmont and Pierpont are currently replicating select SAN data (including Blackboard Vista) to WVNET's SAN for disaster recovery. Additionally, WVNET, Fairmont, and Pierpont have partnered to transfer the knowledge necessary to allow WVNET to provide Blackboard hosting for more institutions in the state than Fairmont and Pierpont could offer alone.

Fairmont and Pierpont's hopes in planning for disaster recovery and remote failover are to reduce our dependency on tape as the sole source for recovery from failure, and to increase system availability to our users. To that end, starting in December we plan to also begin replication of our Banner environments in near-real time to WVNET's XIV SAN. Because we're also a strong VMWare shop, we'll be housing an IBM Blade Center at WVNET running VMWare for our replication endeavors, which will include our Microsoft Active Directory, web services, Microsoft Exchange, and cloud computing environments.

In short, we look forward to a long-lived partnership with WVNET to accomplish our remote disaster recovery site needs."



Evisions has been developing some reports for WVNET, including dashboard type reports, which were demonstrated at the Computer Center Directors' Meeting held at WVNET on September 21-22 (probably demonstrated again at a later date for those not attending the meeting). WVNET should have this installation and database available for testing for at least a couple of months. More info to come!!

WebLogic Training: Oracle has offered to provide a free 2-day technical workshop on WebLogic Server for Banner. This will be a hands-on workshop for technical support staff, and will be offered once at WVNET and again in the southern part of the state. The WebLogic Training has been scheduled for November 3 at WVNET. WebLogic is a replacement for Oracle Internet Application Server used by Banner for both INB (Forms and Reports) and Self Service. IAS (the Oracle webserver that supports Banner forms and Self-Service) is end of life as of December 31, 2011.
