## WVNET powers organizations and institutions in **every** corner of West Virginia.

Every West Virginian — in every county, every community, and every home — benefits from the work of the West Virginia Network for Educational Telecomputing (WVNET).

WVNET connects K-12 schools, higher educational institutions, libraries, state and county government, and various not-for-profits to the Internet and the rest

of the world through our state-of-the-art network and telecommunications expertise. Our team of dedicated IT professionals provide guidance and training to educators and staff in higher education and K-12 schools. Our research and development of software, tools, and systems address problems and tackle challenges that are unique to West Virginia's public institutions and not-forprofits.

#### STATEWIDE IMPACT

WVNET's statewide services are used throughout West Virginia in higher education, K-12 schools, state and county government.

#### HIGHER EDUCATION IMPACT

Learning management systems that allow courses to be delivered online to any student regardless of location (Blackboard)

Student information systems that track grades, transcripts, financial aid and more (Banner)

Student progress and advising tools (DegreeWorks)

#### K-12 IMPACT

Professional learning and development system that allows teachers, staff, and administrators to track, audit, and approve training hours (PLAD)

Secure biometric student tracking systems (gatekeeper)

#### STATE AND COUNTY AGENCIES AND NON-PROFITS

Tracking tools for public service training classes, students, instructors, enrollment and certifications (PSTachio)

Healthcare record-keeping tools that allow health professionals keep track of records dietary forms and other protocols to ensure better and effiecient patient care (FormTrak)

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#### EDU Status

WVNET received our domain designation in the EDU status many years ago; currently this domain status is reserved for only United States affiliated institutions of higher education. When obtaining an enterprise license for products such as Blackboard and Banner, this EDU status avails us to greatly reduced license costs generally not available to government or commercial agencies and we are able to pass those savings onto our customers.

### Cybersecurity

WVNET works to make West Virginia a safer place. Our DDOS mitigation service ensures a secure network. We participate in the Local and State Government CyberSecurity Partnering Workshop.

WVNET is also embarking on a partnership with the NSF Cybersecurity Center for Excellence for an NSF Grant. Led by the Indiana University Center for Applied Cybersecurity Research and including NCSA/UIUC, University of Wisconsin, Oklahoma State University, LBNL, and PSC/CMU as institutional partners. Under the direction of this grant, WVNET staff will be trained in Cybersecurity for Research and training materials will be provided to be used to train our customers in a train the trainer model.

We also partner with MERIT, our sister organization in Michigan, to work with high school students and the Cyber Range Competition. In this competition, teams of high school students compete in the finals of the Cyber Challenge, gaining an in-depth knowledge of cybersecurity.

### WVNET and The Quilt

In 2012, The Quilt, the national coalition of advanced regional networks for research and education, welcomed WVNET as a member. WVNET joined 29 other regional and state networks from around the country participating in The Quilt.



Participants in The Quilt provide advanced network services and applications to over 200 universities and thousands of other educational institutions.

**WVNET's next five years** will focus on creating opportunities to bring our constituents together. We will continue to host and organize state-wide meetings, work groups, events and conferences like the West Virginia State Technology Conference. These efforts will advance our focus on bringing people together to explore needs, encourage dialogue, engender ideas and problem solving, and foster cooperative efforts to maximize efficiencies and cost savings. Our role is to apply our networking strategies to steward relationships that lead to further collaboration and partnerships with WVNET and beyond.

WVNET will help lead the state in cybersecurity education. As part of an NSF grant and partnering with the University of Indiana, WVNET will participate in train the trainer programs on cybersecurity, which will then be implemented statewide.

WVNET is also committed to a strong infrastructure. Our network redesign project is underway and will improve high speed connectivity for our customers.

We continue to strive to maintain transparency in all of our transactions. Problem resolutions are archived and searchable in the Oz Problem Tracking System. All financial audits are publicly available on the Higher Education Policy Commission's website. All service rates are published on WVNET's website. Rate changes and/or new rate structures are vetted with current customers, whenever possible, before they are implemented. New service rates are carefully vetted by the quality management team overseeing that service area. WVNET's internal committee structure dually function as quality control teams. WVNET will continue to provide cost savings solutions to the state of West Virginia.
