

Finance and Business

One of the functions of WVNET is to help the four-year colleges and universities as well as the community and technical colleges save money whenever possible. One way this occurs is for WVNET to enter into consortia contracts with vendors from which our higher education customers can purchase software.

One example of such savings is with the upcoming contract WVNET is entering into with Crayon to provide institutions with access to a wide variety of Microsoft products. Most of the products that are available for purchase off the WVNET contract are at a significant savings per unit price when compared to the MSRP of those same products. For example, an M365 A3 license retails for \$64.44, but through WVNET, the cost is only \$51.16 - a 21% savings!

This is just one way of how WVNET can assist higher education institutions purchase software for their campuses and save money at the same time.

Systems Update

A New Web Interface for Banner Job Submission

WVNET has hosted Banner for multiple schools for many years. To assist with customer needs, a generic web interface was created named "Polaris" where customers could upload and download files and use it to extend the functionality of Banner. While this interface provided basic functionality, it was missing customer user management and other features that many would find to be useful.

The migration of many Banner-related services to Oracle's Cloud Infrastructure (OCI) platform required modernization of several internal WVNET systems including the Banner job submission server. A new job submission server called "Jobsub" was created to replace Polaris, and a new web interface was designed to match.

The new job submission web interface provides all the same features as the old one but was designed with a focus on user-friendliness and security. Many administrative functions on Polaris needed to be carried out over a commandline session and involved running different scripts as well as hand editing configuration files. Now there is no need to leave the browser to manage schools, databases, users, and even printers.

The new interface also defines several new user roles. An "operator" role was created for internal WVNET operations staff to assist with printer management. A "school administrator" role was also introduced to allow delegates from each school to manage users and perform printer tasks that previously required a support call or OZ ticket to be filed. This is also allowing each school administrator to audit the current users.

The move to OCI was more than a 1:1 recreation of existing services. Overall, many improvements were made that benefit end-users at schools as well as the administrators at WVNET. The new web interface is a small, but visible portion of the modernization being done behind the scenes.
